- **6. Description of content:** Describes alternative arrangements to the use of original paper phytosanitary certificates and health certificates due the impacts of COVID-19 on airfreight and courier mail.

This temporary arrangement has been extended until 1 October 2020. Stakeholders will be notified of any further extension to this arrangement closer to this date.

7. Objective and rationale: [] food safety, [X] animal health, [X] plant protection, [] protect humans from animal/plant pest or disease, [] protect territory from other damage from pests. The objective of this policy is to promote safe trade under the impacts of COVID-19.

The COVID-19 pandemic is impacting the movement of airfreight and courier mail globally. This has led some exporting country National Plant Protection Organisations and Veterinary Authorities to advise Australia that they are unable to provide original paperbased phytosanitary and health certificates with import consignments of a range of imported plant-based, animal, biological and animal-based goods.

While international standards require exporting countries to issue original phytosanitary and health certificates, it is up to importing countries how they are processed. Australia's interim arrangements require the exporting country to provide a mechanism to verify copies if required by our inspecting officers.
