6.	<b>Description of content:</b> Equine piroplasmosis, caused by <i>Theileria equi</i> and <i>Babesia caballi</i> are exotic to New Zealand. When importing horses from an equine piroplasmosis infected country, additional to the two serological tests recommended in the Terrestrial Animal Health Code, a PCR assay must also be carried out (with negative results shown). Both parasites can be detected in one generic PCR test.

	If no, describe, whenever possible, how and why it deviates from the international standard: The international standard requires two serological tests. A PCR assay is an additional test to ensure imported horses are not early infected prior to an immune response becoming detectable by serology.
