- **6. Description of content:** Following the OIE reports, ref. No. 6, Vol. 31 dated 2 February 2018 which indicates that Koi herpesvirus disease and Epizootic Ulcerative Syndrome occurred in South Africa, it is deemed necessary for the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia to prevent the entry of the diseases into the country. Therefore, the importation of live fish including ornamental fish from South Africa to the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia is temporarily suspended.

Nature of the urgent problem(s) and reason for urgent action: An outbreak of Koi herpesvirus disease and Epizootic Ulcerative Syndrome was reported by official announcement of the World Organization for Animal Health (OIE) in South Africa. This urges the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia to institute this emergency measure to prevent the entry of the diseases into the country.
