- **6. Description of content:** The notice relates to the decision taken by the Seychelles Government for a temporary ban on all ready-to-eat meat products imported from South Africa due to the outbreak of *Listeria* contamination.
- 7. Objective and rationale: [X] food safety, [] animal health, [] plant protection, [X] protect humans from animal/plant pest or disease, [] protect territory from other damage from pests.
- 8. Nature of the urgent problem(s) and reason for urgent action: An urgent measure has been implemented to manage the sanitary risk associated with the presence of *Listeria* contamination in ready-to-eat meat products in South Africa.

The decision has been taken following the recent outbreak of *Listeria* contamination in ready-to-eat meat in South Africa. Following confirmation from the Ministry of Health in South Africa that the source of *Listeria* contamination and the outbreak is processed meat, the Seychelles Public Health Authority has imposed a temporary ban on all ready-to-eat meat products imported from South Africa.

All processed meat products imported from South Africa, namely polonies, hams and precooked sausages are being removed from the local market. Since the outbreak of *Listeria* started in South Africa several months ago, the Public Health Authority has set up a surveillance programme to test products that are already in the country.
