Interim arrangements

- 1. Where an importer is unable to present the original VHC from the exporting country's Veterinary Authorities as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, our inspection officers will instead accept the electronic copy of the VHC as lodged by the exporting Veterinary Authorities through our contacts provided hereunder.
- 2. Our inspection officers may in some cases request verification of documentation directly from the exporting Veterinary Authorities.
- Where a paper original is issued by the competent authority prior export, we recommend that it is attached to the goods and/or consignments to minimise potential delays at inspection.
- 4. The CVO must submit a list of authorised Email addresses that will submit such certificates to the address mentioned below.
