1. PURPOSE:

1.1 The Department of Rural Development and Land Reform would like to facilitate the appointment of Transaction Advisor to restructure and set up the business operation of the Oshoek properties acquired through Pro-active Land Acquisition Strategy (PLAS) and transferred to the State in year 2013.

- 2.3 Since the formation of the joint venture, the Department has not been receiving rental amount from the joint venture hence very important that the transaction advisor gives thorough report on the day to day existing transaction and also advise on the working models that can be adopted going forward.
- 2.4 All commodities/Enterprises on the farm including enterprise budget per commodity must be covered on the report in detail. The business transactions must also cater for re-investment, maintenance of immovable, movables and biological assets on the farm(s) in question.
