Subject: STANDARD OPERATING PROCEDURE REGARDING COMPLIANCE TO THE INDONESIAN MINISTERIAL DECISION NO.210/KPTS/KR.050/M/4/2021

The Indonesian Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) issued on 19 April 2016 is hereby withdrawn and replaced by the following:

- Agricultural products granted approval for export are as follows: apples, apricot, cherry, citrus fruit, grapefruit, grapes, lemon, nectarine, orange, peach, pears, plum, prunes and shaddock or pomelo.
- 2. The abovementioned agricultural products shall adhere to the Indonesian requirements in terms of testing on pesticide residues, heavy metals and microbiological contaminants.
- 3. Exporters and producers of regulated agricultural products of plant origin to Indonesia must inform the PPECB Regional Office (refer to Annexure A for contact list), at least ten days before export, of their intention to export to Indonesia.
- 4. The Production Units from which products would be sourced must be identified and submitted to the PPECB so that samples for analysis in order to verify compliance with maximum residue limits, banned chemicals, heavy metals and identified microbiological standards as required by the Indonesia Authority can be drawn by PPECB.
- 5. PPECB shall draw samples from one or two sources i.e. unpacked fruit directly from the bins provided that the bins can be directly linked to a Production Unit Code (PUC) or from cartons already packed that can also be directly linked to a PUC.
- All Production Units must comply with the South African food safety export standards and requirements R707 "Standards Regarding Food Hygiene and Food Safety of Regulated Agricultural Food Products of Plant Origin Intended for Export" in May 2005.
- 7. All identified PUC's per variety from which products may be exported shall be sampled by the PPECB, and such samples shall be sent to laboratories that have been registered with Indonesia. (Refer to Annexure B for the list of registered laboratories). No treatment (post harvest chemicals) shall be applied to the products after sampling has taken place.
- 8. Should chemical treatment be applied after samples have been drawn, the provisions referred to in paragraph 11 shall cease to apply, which means that every container that is destined for export to Indonesia shall be subjected to maximum residue testing prior to export.

- After analysis, the registered laboratories shall make available test results to the Department of Agriculture, Land Reform & Rural Development (DALRRD) laboratories and PPECB.
- 10. PPECB will use the test results received from the laboratories to build a profile for compliance of each PUC. A safety certificate with test results shall be issued by the DALRRD laboratory. The export certificate by PPECB shall be issued out based on the DALRRD safety certificate.
- 11. The validity of the safety certificate (per PUC per variety) shall be for a period of two months, from the date of issue of the safety certificate until the date on which the export certificate is signed off by PPECB.
- 12. In cases where products from a specific PUC do not conform to the applicable standards and requirements as indicated above, then such products may not form part of the consignment and therefore may not be exported.
- 13. The PPECB shall annually submit a complete and detailed national monitoring data, including the 14 agricultural products approved by Indonesia on pesticide residues, heavy metals and microbiological contaminants to DALRRD on or before February of every year.
