Procedures to follow for the Scouting of Fall Armyworm (FAW)

Fall Armyworm (FAW) scouting procedures are as follows:


- 1. Determine the field to be sampled.
- Sample each plot in the fields that have been planted at separate times with different varieties, or under varying conditions, differently.
- 3. In the field, walk a path in the shape of the letter, "W", covering the entire

field (see Picture below).

- Inspect 10 plants in a row (at the start, at every turn and at the end).
- 5. Keep track of the number of plants currently infested.
- Information collected during field scouting should be carefully recorded.

N.B. It is important for farmers to do scouting at least once a week for the management of FAW
