Tuta absoluta - Tomato leaf miner/Tuta





ORIGIN: The pest originates from South America.

GEOGRAPHIC DISTRIBUTION: EU, Asia and the Middle East, Central America and the Caribbean and Africa.

STATUS OF *TUTA ABSOLUTA* **IN SOUTH AFRICA**: The pest is present in South Africa and was detected in all the 9 Provinces.

PEST DESCRIPTION: *Tuta absoluta |* Tomato leaf miner is a small moth and tomato plants are the main host but other plants leaves, from eggplant, peppers, potatoes and several weeds, may also be attacked.

CONTROL PRACTICES: The pest spreads through seedlings as well as fruit and it can be controlled by chemical, biological and cultural control measures.

NB: This pest can cause serious yield losses of 50 to 100%. Agrochemicals with different modes of action and resistance groups must be rotated after every second application to avoid the development of resistance.
