APRICOTS AND PLUMCOTS

- An Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service (APHIS) import permit is required;
- The fruit must be a commercial consignment as defined in U.S. Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) under 7 CFR § 319.56-2;
- Each consignment is subject to inspection upon arrival in the United States and all general requirements of 7 CFR 319.56-3;
- Each consignment must be accompanied by a phytosanitary certificate with an additional declaration stating that the fruit was inspected and found free of cinch bug, *Macchiademus diplopterus*; and
- Each consignment must be treated with the APHIS approved cold treatment T107-e for fruit flies (*Ceratitis* spp.) and the false codling moth (*Thaumatotibia leucotreta*).

SWEET CHERRIES

- An APHIS import permit is required;
- The fruit must be a commercial consignment as defined in the 7 CFR §319.56-2;
- Each consignment is subject to inspection upon arrival in the United States and all general requirements of 7 CFR 319.56-3;
- Each consignment must be accompanied by a phytosanitary certificate issued by the National Plant Protection Organization of South Africa; and
- Each consignment must be treated with the APHIS approved cold treatment Tl07a for the fruit fly, *Ceratitis capitata* and the false codling moth (*Thaumatotibia leucotreta*).
