Plants = 80% of the food we eat and 98% of the oxygen we breathe.

Up to 40% of food crops are lost due to plant pests and diseases every year.

Major Culprits are Climate change and International travel and trade, which has tripled in volume in the last decade, is also spreading pests and diseases.











- **❖** Several verses refer to the blasting (KJV) or blight (NIV) of crops. Deuteronomy 28:22 and II Chronicles 6:28.
- **❖** Obviously, some plant disease is intended in these verses but it is not possible to specifically identify which disease.
- Since the major crops were the grains wheat and barley, we can assume that the diseases attacked these crops.









## **Current History**

The IPPC Secretariat is attached to the FAO.



The FAO has welcomed a UN decision to establish an annual IDPH, an issue critical in addressing global hunger.

The observance, to be held every 12 May, was championed by Zambia and unanimously adopted by the UN General Assembly. The Day is a key legacy of the International Year of Plant Health, which was marked in 2020-2021.

- 1. Increase awareness of the importance of healthy plants to achieve the UN 2030 Agenda, particularly SDG 2 (Zero Hunger).
- 2. Campaign to minimize the risk of spreading plant pests through trade and travel, by ensuring compliance with international plant health standards.
- 3. Strengthen monitoring and early warning systems to protect plants and plant health.
- **4**. Enable sustainable pest and pesticide management to keep plants healthy while protecting the environment.
- **5**. Promote investment in plant health innovations, research, capacity development and outreach.
