- A signed declaration form indicating that the applicant is not a public servant or a public office bearer.
- All successful applicants will be required to undergo a skills assessment to identify skills gaps, which the department will assist with the necessary training.
- The application should indicate the number of livestock that the applicant owns, and their livestock-branding certificate, farm machinery and equipment where applicable.
- Crop farmer registration certificates and or affidavits must be attached in cases of crop farming.
- <u>Shortlisted applicants are expected to attend compulsory briefing session and site inspection at a venue, date and time to be communicated at a later stage.</u>
- If shortlisted, you will be required to avail yourself, your related farming machinery and equipment and your livestock (biological assets) where applicable for verification purposes and attend Evaluation interviews at the time and place determined by the Department during which, you will be expected to present a Business plan/proposal based on the information gathered during the compulsory farm visit.
