Nombuyiselo Madodana from the Eastern Cape started working in March 2014 as a seasonal worker for the Bingqala Pine apple Co-op located under Ngqushwa local municipality. She was employed permanently in January 2015 and is responsible for administration, planting, fertilization, weed removing, reading of rain gauge, weighing and mixing of chemicals, cleaning and harvesting. She ensures that the health and safety standards are maintained in compliance with Department of Employment and Labour requirements. The nominee always keeps good working relations among her fellow farm workers. She came up with the idea of filling up the tractors with fuel on daily basis after work in order to save time and allow tractor drivers to start work immediately the following day without any delays.

Noluthando Mdayi who is the owner of the Mdayi Agricultural project located in Picardy, an area approximately 21km away from Fort Beaufort in Queenstown in the **Eastern Cape**. She started farming in 1992 in her back yard garden where she was producing vegetables such as cabbages, spinach, onions and beetroot. She currently owns 42 cattle, 77 goats, 26 sheep and 53 indigenous chickens mainly for household consumption for meat and eggs. Ms Mdayi sells goats especially during June and December season mostly for rituals and also sells wool from her sheep. Ms Mdayi is a very dedicated farmer and donates to schools.

Patricia Betsha is a member of Bafazi Phambili which is owned by six emale beneficiaries who started farming in a commonage in 2006. The project is situated in Jansenville under Dr Beyers Naude Local Municipality in the Eastern Cape. They are operating in a 2 ha farm and are farming with broiler chickens at a smaller scale whereby they raise 1500 chicks on a temporary structure granted by Department of Rural Development and Agrarian Reform (DRDAR). They were assisted by DRDAR with another structure with a carrying capacity of about 3200 chicks and a cool room due to their commitment to the business. In 2016 beneficiaries won R15, 000 .00 in the district Female Entrepreneur Award and with that money they fenced in their Poultry structures.

Rochelle Greyling started working in 2017 for a company Called Kleinbegin, which was at the time supplying untreated fencing poles through an agent to the Co-operations in the Eastern Cape. She worked as a Manager and started running the whole Fencing operation, she learnt more of the process and realized that she could start doing her own business. She registered Rochgreys Forest Projects and became a member at NCT Co- Operation in 2012 and approved in August and started supplying them in 2012. Since 2012 the company has supplied NCT with over 70 000 tons of timber and the orders are still ongoing and also supplied TWK with over 100 000 of timber, including pine, wattle and Gum. In 2013 she purchased the Company Kleinbegin from the previous owner. In June 2018, Rochgreys collaborated with a company called Silicon smelter who gave her a contract to produce charcoal to them.

This company was started by a young black female after passing matric her in 2013, the aim was to create self-employment. She acquired 85ha of land on a lease agreement in Qumbu. She produced vegetables and started selling locally. Currently the production increased and the business grew, she now sells to Supermarkets such Spar, Pick 'n Pay, Food Lovers, Ideal Veg, also supplies Dan's Lodge and some local restaurants. The business also conducts agricultural trainings and provides technical support to other young producers.

The project is situated at St Augustine's village in Maclear at Elundini Local Municipality in Joe Gqabi District. They produce vegetables such as cabbages, carrots, spinach, beetroot, beans, lettuce, potatoes, pumpkins and beans mainly for consumption and sells the surplus. The project also produces broilers, indigenous layers and pigs. The main objective of the project is to alleviate poverty within her family and sell to the community to generate some income.

Landiswa Diniso, a sole owner of Landiswa Diniso Livestock Enterprise which is located in Burgersdorp. Although Landiswa was born with a disability in her left leg, and has to wear a brace to support her leg; she has never allowed her disability to limit her from attaining her goals. Landiswa grew up on a farm and when she left the farm for the township, her uncle gave her a calf. She kept her calf in a commonage and in 2015 that cow calved and that is how the business started. She received support from the Department of Rural Development and Agrarian Reform in the form of fodder and goats. To date, Landiswa Diniso Livestock Enterprise is now involved in the rearing of cattle, goats, pigs and has a small patch where she plants vegetables for her household and sells the surplus. She supplies milk and surplus vegetable to the neighbouring community.

In 1999 she then focused more on Animal Production and later sent to a Computer Course in order to improve her data capturing and record keeping skills and was promoted to be the assistant leader of her team in 2012. To date, she is leading the team responsible for Beef Production.

Mieta Mpholo started Mmmokeng Wa Maqheku in 2007 in Zamdela Sasolburg in the Free State in her backyard vegetable garden with the purpose of uniting and keeping elderly people active during the day and also to alleviate poverty within the area. There are currently 70 elderly people in the Cooperative who come to the garden on Mondays till Friday. The produce that comes from the garden is used in the kitchen; Onions, Tomatoes and Cabbages etc and the surplus is given to the elderly to take home and more donated to the Day Care centre and the remainder sold to the communities. They received funding of 2 small tunnels from Sasol and irrigation system as well as palisade fence from

Seriti (former Anglo American mine).

Sells Maize to SENWES and SUIDWES at current market price and cattle weaners are sold at 8-9 months old to feedlots at R38 per Kilogram. Currently employs two permanent workers and is a mentor for Kgotsong Commonage Farmers and also gives wood to the community for funerals.

The difficult journey from R200 funded survivalist business to a multi award winning SMME and was incited on by occasional financial injections. She has been bestowed with seven awards (7) and received grants through small business development competitions sponsored by various institutions. Golden Goose currently produces 1500 to 2000 Litres of Motoho per month and is supplying various retail outlets in and around Welkom and Virginia.

Ms Catherine Morudu started working as a domestic worker at Izintaba Crocodile farm since 1998 and would occasionally assist with the crocodile production activities after finishing her daily chores. Due to her satisfactory work performance, Catherine was given a general worker position that also allowed her to work in the farm abattoir. She was later promoted to an abattoir supervisor where she is now responsible for the supervision of four employees, verification of orders, ensuring adherence to industry practices while slaughtering such as hygiene and acceptable slaughtering methods. She is also responsible for overseeing correct packaging of produce for export. The 21 years of experience in crocodile farming have groomed Ms Morudu to become a seasoned worker who now has thorough understanding of the crocodile behaviour, and can now tell when it is safe to walk in and collect eggs from their nests and place them in the hatchery. She has also undergone a few trainings including first aid so she can handle emergency situations accordingly.

She took up on a job offer in Asset Management but only for a year, in 2015 she started left the company and started to Free Range Chickens around Sandton area where she stays and then established her own company by the name of Local Village (Pty) Ltd. She revolved her staff quarters into a working space and processing plant. From reading African fiction, travelling and exploring different flavours, she learnt about various types of indigenous African cousins enjoyed across the continent. She then decided to source Teff and cleaned, process and package it, and then ventured into more grains/superfoods and gluten free flour as well and she processes them.

Mampe Filipina Mmeregi acquired her 214ha farm Temaretha Piggery Farming through PLAS in 2009 and is divided into different sections of which 120ha of the farm is arable land and the rest is used for Piggery production as well as Vegetable Production.

She currently has 250 Sows and 4 Boars with 250 sow units. She has received several awards and achievements for the good work she does. In year 2011, she received the prize for 2nd runner up in the Agri Business woman of the year competition and in 2013 became the 1st runner up. In the same year 2013 she was identified by AFGRI Harvest Time Investment Farmer Development Programme and received a 5 year support. She performed well under the support of AFGRI and her yields shot from 2.5 tons/ha to 5.5tons/ha. In 2016 she then received a grant from GEP worth of R30 000 and used it to buy a Boom Spray, and also managed to secure a loan to purchase a Hammer Mill. She sells her produce at abattoirs such as ASA abattoir, supplying them with 50 porkers per week and sells live pigs at auctions and sells weaners at 6-12 weeks with 25kg weight. Ms Mmeregi has attended various different Agricultural Courses and she is well equipped and is very active in empowering developing and up -coming farmers on production techniques.

Victoria Matebogo Mouwane, who has a hearing-impairement, started her business in Westonaria Agri Park in 2016 and legally registered the entity in 2017. She has 20 tunnels with eight shade nets and one sprout house in a land space of 10ha. She plants 800 tomatoes in six tunnels, 600 cucumbers and 800 peppers in 4 tunnels. Her passion for research and book reading assisted her to find out about farming with nets which she transferred her acquired skills to other deaf workers she employed in the entity. She sells her produce to the local hawkers, Pick' n Pay and Fruits and Veg Market and the profit is reinvested back into the business. The enterprise seasonally employs five (5) and permanently employs seven (7) workers. She has adopted a school for the deaf where she sponsors 10 kids; bought all workers bicycles and donates vegetables to

old age society and two crèches in Mohlakeng.

Sizeni rejoice Ngidi is from Bulwer Dr Nkosazana Dlamini-Zuma Municipality within the Harry Gwala District Municipality. She started working for KPP Piggery in 2011 as a general worker when the farm owner ventured in the piggery business. In 2018 she was promoted to an Assistant Supervisor/Team Leader. This was at the point when the farm grew and was able to employ seven (7) other general contract workers. Her responsibilities include general work and supervision, working at the weaner house; ensure that the weaner house operates smoothly. She motivates workers, encourages them and assists greatly as a problem solver. She coordinates the supervision of the piggery houses and ensures timeous reporting to the owner. With her minimum education and the expertise acquired during the eight (8) years in the farm, Rejoice assists the in-service students from the uMzimkhulu and Tsolo Colleges of Agriculture during their practical training.

Tholakele Florence Sibiya is from Danhauser, Newcastle in Amajuba District. She began planting vegetables such as spinach, butternut, sunflower, beans, sweet potatoes as well as sugar cane and rosemary on a small 10x10m land and a 7m chicken house which she used for her five fowls. Being a rural farm girl, born and raised in land reform farm ,she turned her exposure of working on the commercial farm

to means of providing for her family. She sells her small production surplus to provide her families' livelihood. The number of chickens increased making her to add chicken four (4) houses so that she could keep her different rare breeds of chicken in different houses. She sells the indigenous chickens during traditional ceremonies and eggs to the local community. She chooses rotational crops with nutritious value for the soil such as sunflower which reduce erosion, increase soil organic matter contents etc. In her field, she puts a hurricane light that attracts insects and when attracted, they get trapped and die as they inhale the methylated spirit. She plants organically without using chemicals, where she uses cow dung and chicken waste versus the fertilisers for her vegetable garden. Most of the chickens are for consumption and sells surplus. She supports the local community with vegetable donations for funerals and needy families.

The enterprise also has a nursery. Ms Gumede extended her market from supplying only the local vendors and hawkers to hospitals. Merice currently employs one permanent worker and donates some of their products to old age homes and also sponsors prizes for fundraisings.
